

THE SIX TALL SHIPS



NIAGARA

This historical brig is a perfect replica of the original model of 1813. It testifies of the conflict which set the United States against the British Empire over maritime law. The Niagara's mission is to re-enact this famous armed conflict and to promote maritime traditions in the Pennsylvania and Lake Erie regions.



PRIDE OF BALTIMORE II

Respecting the specifications of a topsail schooner from the time of the War of 1812, its mission is to commemorate and promote marine innovations arising from this conflict and from the famous *Baltimore Clippers*, a fast sailing fleet of two-mast ships used to transport merchandise along American coastline.



PATHFINDER

This brigantine has been sailing the Great Lakes since 1964 and was built specifically for young people. This magnificent two-mast vessel has allowed over 15,000 young people to live a unique experience sailing aboard a tall ship!



CHALLENGE

This three-mast Bermuda-rigged schooner is well-known to residents of the Toronto region. Visitors can sail on Lake Ontario and see the city from a whole new vantage point.



LYNX

This topsail schooner is a reproduction of the original privateer of the same name that sailed during the War of 1812. The original vessel was known as one of the *Baltimore Clippers* fleet's best ships and was one of the first ships to defend American liberty.



ST. LAWRENCE II

Sailing the Great Lakes since 1957, this brigantine has been training young crews to manoeuvre square sails. Much like *The Pathfinder*, the captain is often the only adult on board to supervise the avid 18-member crew of students seeking to learn about sailing while aboard.
